CITY OF ADA REGULAR MEETING APRIL 2, 2018

The Ada City Council met in regular session, Monday, April 2, 2018 at 5:45 p.m. at City Hall in the Dr. Ray L. Stout City Council Chamber. Advanced public notice was given by posting the agenda on the City Hall bulletin boards on Thursday, March 29, 2018 at 2:00 p.m.

Mayor Sewell called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m.

Mayor Sewell led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor Sewell called for a moment of silence for personal prayer or introspection.

Motion was made by **Councilman Landrum** seconded by **Councilman McFarlin** to approve the Consent Agenda as presented. Mayor Sewell called for the vote recorded as follows:

Discussion of and action on request from Jim Hart for reduction of abatement lien on the property located at 415 East 13th Street

City Manager Holcomb reported the property at 415 East 13th had been abated seven times between November 2014 and November 2017 for grass and weeds and/or trash and junk. The total amount of liens filed is \$2,496.82, and the total of interest and penalties is \$824.36, which has a total due of \$3,321.17. Mr. Holcomb reported this abatement parcel would be classified as No. 3, which allows Council to reduce the lien by an amount up to the amount of accrued penalty and interest.

Motion was made by **Councilman McFarlane**, seconded by **Councilman McFarlin** to approve request from Jim Hart for the reduction of abatement lien on the property located at 415 East 13th, with the reduction of the penalty and interest accrued on the abatement liens to date, and is contingent on payment of the original amount of the liens, totaling \$2,496.81. City Manager Holcomb advised the proposed contract is to perform construction inspections and project management services for various City projects. Mr. Holcomb advised there is a five percent increase over last year's inspection services contract to cover anticipated increases in insurance costs and wages for the inspector.

Motion was made by **Councilman McFarlin**, seconded by **Councilman Landrum** to approve Contract for Professional Services with Great Plains Consulting to perform construction inspection and project management services for various City of Ada projects including, but not limited to, the following: Senior Citizens Center, Wintersmith Music and Movie Venue, Transfer Station, Main Street Streetscape, Landfill Gas Cutoff Trench, Highway 99 Waterline Relocation, Wells No. 4 and No. 5, Byng Waterline Relocation, Van Horn Sewer Line, and Stadium Waterline. The City Manager reviewed with Council the commitment to provide matching funds for the CDBG Grant to purchase the fire/rescue truck and equipment. Mr. Holcomb explained the Oklahoma Department of Commerce is now requiring that the City approve a contract agreement with the truck manufacturer as part of the grant process.

Mayor Sewell called for the vote recorded as follows:

City Manager Holcomb discussed the bids received for the demolition of Irving School, recommending the bid from M & M Wrecking, Inc., as the lowest responsible bid for the City, in the amount of \$101,846.00, approval of Notice of Award to M & M Wrecking, Inc.; approval of authorization for the Mayor to execute any and all necessary documents related to the Project, including, but not limited to, the Contract and Notice to Proceed. Mayor Sewell called for the vote recorded as follows:

Discussion of and action on approval of Professional Services Agreement with Burns & McDonnell to prepare a Water Reuse Feasibility Study in the amount of \$272,386.00
