# CITY OF ADA REGULAR MEETING APRIL 1, 2019

The Ada City Council met in regular session, Monday, April 1, 2019 at 5:45 p.m. at City Hall in the Dr. Ray L. Stout City Council Chamber. Advanced public notice was given by posting the agenda on the City Hall bulletin boards on Friday, March 29, 2019 at 11:35 a.m.

Vice Mayor Morris called the meeting to order at 5:45 p.m.

Vice Mayor Morris led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

# Discussion of and action on items removed from the Consent Agenda

Public hearing and discussion of and action on an ordinance providing for the re-zoning of certain property within the City of Ada, Oklahoma, from I-2, Light Industrial District, to C-2, General Commercial District, and declaring an emergency for the following described property:

The western 105 feet of the following described property, a part of the NW/4 of NW/4 of SE/4 of Section 28, Township 4 North, Range 6 East of the I.B.M., Pontotoc County, Oklahoma, more particularly described as follows: beginning at the northwest corner of the NW/4 of NW/4 of SE/4 of said Section 28; thence east along the north line of said subdivision a distance of 330 feet; thence south and parallel with the east line of said subdivision a distance of 91 feet; thence west and parallel with the north line of said subdivision a distance of 330 feet to the west line of said subdivision; thence north along the west line of said subdivision to the point of beginning.

This property is also known as 1406 North Broadway.

City Manager Cody Holcomb presented the re-zoning request from Mr. Ellis Cain and Mr. Kelsey Cain representing Aloha Trust. The City Manager advised they want to rezone the western 105 feet of their property to C-2 General Commercial District, to allow for a commercial business in the existing front building on their property. The back building and surrounding open area will remain zoned as industrial for the medical marijuana growing facility in the rear of this building, with the applicants planning to move offices they currently have at another location into the front of this building.

Mr. Cain addressed the Council, answering questions as presented.

Public hearing and discussion of and action on an ordinance providing for the re-zoning of certain property within the City of Ada, Oklahoma, from R-1, One-Family District, to R-2, Two-Family District, and declaring an emergency for the following described property:

All of Lots 7 & 8, Block 31 of the Original Townsite of Ada, Pontotoc County, Oklahoma.

This property is also known as 716 and 730 North Johnston.

The City Manager presented the request from Mr. Demetrius Williams to rezone the described property for the construction of duplexes. Mr. Holcomb advised City Staff and the Planning and Zoning Commission both recommended approval of the request.

A part of the SW/4 of Section 25, Township 4 North, Range 6 East, more particularly described as follows: beginning at a point 1350 feet north of the southwest corner of Section 25; thence east a distance of 210 feet; thence north a distance of 90 feet; thence west a distance of 210 feet; thence south a distance of 90 feet to the point of beginning.

This property is also known as 1104 North Monte Vista.

City Manager Holcomb advised the rezoning request for 1104 N. Monte Vista was from Mr. Dakota Hector, representing DLH Ventures, to rezone for office use in an existing building.
