## CITY OF ADA REGULAR MEETING NOVEMBER 15, 2021

The Ada City Council met in a regular meeting, Monday, November 15, 2021 at 5:45 p.m., at Ada City Hall, in the Dr. Ray L. Stout City Council Chamber, 231 S. Townsend. Advanced public notice was given by posting the agenda on the City Hall bulletin board on Wednesday, November 10, 2021 at 1:10 p.m., and posting on the City of Ada web site Wednesday, November 10, 2021.

The meeting of the Ada City Council was called to order by Mayor Randy McFarlin.

Mayor McFarlin led the audience in the Pledge of Allegiance.

Mayor McFarlin called for a moment of silence.

Mayor McFarlin called for nominations for appointment to fill vacancy in the At-Large City Council position.

**Councilman Hargrave** nominated Karen Hudson to fill the vacancy. The nomination was seconded by **Councilman Morris**.

Discussion of and action on bids for Wintersmith Trail Improvements Project (CDBG 2020 Sidewalk Grant – Concrete Sidewalks); authorization for Mayor or his designee to execute any and all documents related to said grant project, including, but not limited to, the Notice of Contract Award, Contract and Notice to Proceed

City Manager Holcomb presented sealed bids for the Wintersmith Trail Improvements Project for Concrete Sidewalks. Mr. Holcomb on behalf of City Staff recommends the awarding of the contract to Weldon Construction Company, LLC, with the lowest responsible bid, in the amount of \$247,897.09.

Motion was made by **Councilman Sewell**, seconded by **Councilman Morris** to award the bid for Wintersmith Trail Improvements Project (CDBG 2020 Sidewalk Grant-Concrete Sidewalks) to Weldon Construction Company, LLC, with the lowest responsible bid in the amount of \$247,897.09. City Manager Holcomb advised the Proposition 1 and Proposition 2 ordinances had been approved at the November 1<sup>st</sup> Council Meeting, to be placed on the ballot in February 2022. Mr. Holcomb explained it had been brought to his attention that the State passed a new Code that limited ballot wording to 200 words, with the Proposition 2 ballot having 210 words. The City Manager explained the City Attorney has prepared a new Proposition 2 ordinance that repeals and replaces the previously approved ordinance, and meets the guidelines of the Election Board. # Discussion of and action on Agreement with WHIT Industries, LLC to integrate sewage lift stations and water towers into the SCADA system at Water Treatment Plant

City Manager Holcomb advised this Agreement would allow the City to collect real-time data remotely for both the water and sewer systems. This Agreement would provide hardware and installation to integrate the City's sewage lift stations and the distribution from the water towers into the OnPing SCADA System at the Water Treatment Plant, with a project cost of \$188,000.00.

Motion was made by **Councilman Hargrave**, seconded by **Councilman Sewell** to approve Agreement with WHIT Industries, LLC to integrate sewage lift stations and water towers into the SCADA system at Water Treatment Plan, with a total cost of \$188,000.00. Mayor McFarlin called for a vote taken with the following result:
